I thought that I could do it on my own, by retiring to my room and reading theology, and I wouldn't go to the churches. . . But as I went on I saw the great merit of it. There has been an emphasis on learning about God propositionally versus personally.

Up to the age of 30 poetry of many kinds gave me great pleasure. Even as a schoolboy I took intense delight of Shakespeare, especially in a historical sense. Even pictures have given me a considerable delight. Music has given me a very great delight. But now for many years I cannot delight in reading a single line of poetry. I've tried to read Shakespeare but have found it so intolerably dull that it nauseated me. I've also lost almost all taste for pictures and music. I've retained some taste for fine scenery, but it does not cause me the exquisite delight that it formally did. My mind it seems has become some kind of machine for grinding out general laws from a large collection of facts. But why this should have caused the atrophy of that part of the brain alone on which the higher tastes depends I cannot conceive. The loss of these tastes is the loss of happiness and may possibly be injurious to the intellect and more possibly damaging to the moral character by enfeebling the emotional part of our nature.

There is little power.

There is much silence about Jesus.

There are fewer willing to leave everything behind and go.
