



NUMBER OF EARTHQUAKES THAT HAVE TAKEN 1000+ LIVES





But the one who endures to the end will be saved.









Baby Calum just wouldn't wait

Someone is going to have to teach baby Calum some patience, or he's likely to be early for the rest of his life.

Calum just couldn't wait to be born. In fact, his delivery Thursday evening was in Hood River Memorial Hospital's lobby.

The son of Trina and Steve Fowler was born at 6:16 p.m., only a half-hour after his mother went into labor — a fast labor, with initial contractions coming every 16 seconds, said Barbara Young, Hood River Memorial Hospital's community relations director.

Labor began at 5:45 p.m., just after the family finished supper. After getting a friend to set for the Fowler's three other children, Steve and Trina raced from their Indian Creek Road home to the hospital.
