Barnabas Groups are an amazing "network", a vital link and front-line connection for supporting International Workers. Members serve to inform the SAC congregation about the worker and ministry.

You work together strategically to provide the support, prayer and encouragement while the worker is in-the-field and when on home assignment.

You extend care, connection and compassion in practical/tangible ways to a worker, becoming an advocate for the spiritual, physical, emotional and financial needs of the worker/ministry.

You serve as the key communication link between the worker and the church.

Workers are more likely to be effective in their ministry when they know that people back home (their church family) are interested in them personally and in their work. The key to supporting missions is consistent communication, affirming the worker, and assuring them they are covered in prayer.

Supporting Workers

Some of our International Workers have a BARNABAS Group, that *consistently supports* them and their ministry. However, not all workers have a support network at Salem Alliance Church.

Barnabas Groups meet once a week each month on a Saturday, Sunday or other designated date. Special meetings are announced in the church bulletin and website.
